Welcome to the NAFSC Learn to Skate USA basic skills badge program! Designed by U.S. Figure Skating, the Learn to Skate USA Program is a top-quality beginning ice skating program serving the needs of both recreational and competitive skaters. The North Atlantic Figure Skating Club (NAFSC) offers Learn To Skate USA program classes September through June, a summer LTS fun program, and year round ice for figure skating.

Skaters who participate in the Learn to Skate USA Program will learn new and exciting maneuvers and will be tested as they progress through the program. Skaters will receive Learn to Skate USA (basic skills) membership, an official Learn to Skate USA record book to track progress through the program, sport accident insurance, a parent handbook, a Learn to Skate USA magazine filled with helpful information about all aspects of skating, and a certificate and badge or a skills report card and ribbon at the end of each session. I'M NEW! WHERE DO I START?!

New skaters should register for Snowplow Sam if the skater is 5 years old or younger or Basic Skills if the skater is 6 years or older. New adult skaters should register for the Adult Badge classes. Coaches will assess new skaters on the first day to ensure they are in the correct level. Many of our new teenage skaters choose to register for the Adult Badge session, please contact skatingdirector@nafsc.me if you believe this may be a better fit for your skater.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO BEFORE THE FIRST CLASS?

Arrive ready to learn! We recommend all skaters arrive at Family Ice Center 15 minutes before the start of their first class to prepare to get on the ice. Make sure to have skates, warm layers, gloves and a helmet (if required). NO rental skates or helmets are available. Make sure to get skates sharpened before your first class!



Equipment

- Rental skates will NOT BE AVAILABLE.
- Double runner skates are not allowed.
- Ski/sport helmets are REQUIRED for all skaters 3-5 years old. NAFSC and Family Ice Center do not provide helmets for rent. Skaters of all ages are encouraged to wear a helmet or other protective gear if they feel more comfortable.
- Mittens or gloves are required. Dress in warm layers.
- Snowplow Sam, Basic Skills, and Adult Badge skaters may wear hockey or figure skates.

Skate Fit & Care

- Skates should be fit with a thin sock.
- The skater's ankles should be supported.
- Tie skates tight in foot bed from the top of toe to the beginning of ankle, then slightly looser at the top of the ankle.
- Skate blades should be dried with towel after each use and covered in a terry cloth cover ("soft" guards) between sessions. This will protect the blade during transport and storage.
- Hard guards should be used to cover blades while walking around, avoid resting the blade on the bleachers without protection.
- Skates should be sharpened approximately every 22-30 hours of use and if skates have not been used in over nine months. Skaters will feel the blades sliding when they need to be sharpened.
- New skates usually need to be sharpened before they are used.
